## Key facts:

- Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole were two women who helped changed how people thought of women and nursing.
- Florence Nightingale changed the way that hospitals looked after their patients and the way people thought about nurses and women. She made hospitals cleaner, provided good food and saved many lives. Florence showed that trained nurses and clean hospitals could help sick people get better. Because of this, she is called the founder of modern nursing.
- Mary Seacole is remembered for her role in helping wounded soldiers in the Crimean War. She fought against being treated differently because of the colour of her skin.


